## **Friends**

In my 1999 visit to Chiang Mai for the weather conference I met and became friends with Sunida, a receptionist at the Lotus Hotel. We corresponded by email and postal mail leading up to this 2002 Thailand visit. I had met her young son in 1999. My study of Okada's teachings became my project for my first Perspectives course (www.perspectives.org) in Fall 2001.

I was given a ride from Phayao Bible College to Chiang Mai, rather than riding the bus. After arrival Sunida's

family took me back to the Mae Sa elephant camp that I visited in 1999.


