Today, Sunday, we went to this building, built about a hundred years ago. We were served a good lunch along with some deaf people. Ten years ago people at this authorized church were only old women. Five years ago still no men. Now there are about a thousand people associated, all ages from pre-school to elderly and lots of men. There are also blind people but we did not see them. Old people tend to attend the first service, middle aged the middle service, and young

adults the 1 PM service which we attended, including two of our students. Music was done with enthousiasm with Chinese words and tunes. Perhaps there were about sixty people there of that age group. The topic was the Joseph story from the first book. Several people were near us to tell us in English what was being said. Afterwards we met with some of those young people in the basement for a sharing session. This was the best such fellowship I have experienced in all my trips to China.
